Suspected misconduct with minors by lay church personnel should be reported to the pastor of the parish, the principal of the school, or the head of the Catholic institution involved. Suspected misconduct with minors by a priest, deacon, or religious should be reported directly to the Bishop or Vicar General (P. O. Box 2279, Brownsville, TX 78522-2279; 956-542-2501). A form for a *Confidential Notice of Concern*, may be used, and obtained on request from the local pastor, school principal, institution head, or Diocese, or it may be downloaded from the Brownsville Diocese website (www.cdob.org).

Please be aware that it is a state law that anyone who suspects abuse or neglect of a minor must report it to local law enforcement officials or to the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services at 1-800-252-5400.

PROTEGIENDO AL PUEBLO DE DIOS

Como el pueblo de Dios, cada uno de nosotros está llamado a celebrar, promover, y, si es necesario, defender la vida y la dignidad de todas personas. Tenemos que tratar a cada persona con respeto, y hacer lo posible para asegurar que nunca se dañe a los demás.

Una sospecha de mala conducta con los menores de edad, cometida por el personal laico de la iglesia, deberá reportarse al párroco de la iglesia, al director de la escuela, o al encargado de la institución católica en cuestión. Una sospecha de mala conducta con los menores de edad cometida por un sacerdote, diácono, o religioso deberá reportarse directamente al Señor Obispo o al Vicario General al (P.O. Box 2279, Brownsville, TX 78522-2279; 956-542-2501). Una forma para un *Aviso Confidencial de Inquietud (Confidential Notice of Concern)* puede obtenerse a través del párroco local, del director de la escuela, del encargado de la institución, de la Diócesis, o puede bajarse de la página oficial de Internet de la Diócesis de Brownsville (www.cdob.org).

Por favor recuerde que hay una ley estatal que cualquier persona que sospeche el abuso o la negligencia hacia un menor de edad debe reportarlo a las autoridades oficiales locales o al Departamento de Servicios Familiares y Protectores de Texas (Texas Department of Family and Protective Services) al 1-800-252-5400.


SACRAMENTS

TODAY'S WORD OF GOD **March 3, 2024**

Today we hear God deliver the ten commandments to Moses and the Chosen People. The commandments provide a way for them to live up to their part of the covenant. We face the same challenge today. Lent is a wonderful opportunity to examine our consciences and recall times when we have failed to follow one of God's commands and determine which commandments we find difficulty to obey consistently. Particularly during this penitential season, let us repent of our sins, reconcile with God and those we've wronged, and pray for the grace to do better.

Today's readings are very familiar. We hear the ten commandments, which we probably memorized as children. In the Gospel, Jesus drives the money changers out of the temple, overturning their tables and spilling their coins. Let us challenge ourselves to listen to these words today as if God is personally speaking to us, telling us how to live and reminding us of the purpose of worship. With Easter less than a month away now, let us take to heart the words of the psalmist: "Lord, you have the words of everlasting life.

PALABRA DE DIOS DE HOY **3 de marzo 2024**

Hoy escuchamos como Dios les da los diez mandamientos a Moisés y al pueblo escogido. Los mandamientos les proporcionan una manera de cumplir su parte de la alianza. Nosotros nos enfrentamos hoy con el mismo desafío. La Cuaresma es una oportunidad estupenda para examinar nuestra conciencia a fin de recordar las veces que hemos faltado a uno de los mandamientos de Dios y determinar cuáles son los mandamientos que se nos hacen más difíciles de obedecer consistentemente. Arrepintámonos de nuestros pecados, reconciliémonos con Dios y con las personas que hemos perjudicado, y oremos por obtener la gracia de mejorar, particularmente durante este tiempo penitencial.

Las lecturas de hoy nos son muy familiares. Oímos los diez mandamientos, que probablemente hemos memorizado desde niños. En el Evangelio, Jesús expulsa del templo a los vendedores y cambistas, volcando sus mesas y tirando al suelo sus monedas. Hagámonos nosotros mismos el desafío de escuchar estas palabras de hoy como si Dios nos estuviera hablando personalmente, diciéndonos como vivir y recordándonos el propósito de rendirle adoración. Con la Pascua ahora a menos de un mes, tomemos en serio las palabras del salmista: "Tú tienes, Señor, palabras de vida eterna".
